BACK TO STOCK CARS

Two Top Class Team Events In Tonight's Thrill Session

AFTER the death-defying performances of the Hollywood Motor Rodeo stuntmen, we return to Stock Car Racing this evening with a thrill-packed programme in which the main events are the Inter-Track Match, Harringay v. Southampton, and the Inter-County fixture, Middlesex v. Kent.

In both cases the teams consist of the most experienced drivers in the country and although we cannot tell what will be the outcome, in a sport where anything can and does happen, we are convinced that you will see an all-action programme which will produce incidents from beginning to end.

Although they are newcomers to the track, the Southampton drivers are far from new to the sport and they have such a big reputation down on the Hampshire track that we may conceivably be on the losing end.

TANYA "GUESTS"

With one of their best drivers not available, the Saints asked for permission to include our own, and Britain's No. 1, lady driver Tanya Crouch. We readily agreed to the Southampton request although we fully realised that by so doing we were jeopardising our own chances of success.

It doesn't need us to say how well Tanya knows her way round the Harringay circuit and the hints that she will be able to give her team mates will be valuable indeed. Tanya has no mercy and expects none and the same goes for all the Southampton team.

INTER-COUNTY

The second team event tonight brings together those old rivals Middlesex and Kent and two more evenly balanced sides it would be difficult to name. Lining up with Middlesex will be Jake Jacobs, who has shown so many times that he has no respect whatsoever for opposing riders.

It's our guess that Jake will be the spoiler of the side and if he does adopt that role, then heaven help Kent!

But the Kent boys'll not be afraid to mix it. They've got a team that will crash and bash their way through with the best of them and will be out to prove that what Essex did (they beat Middlesex 9-6 three weeks ago) Kent can do better.

Perhaps we'd better warn the Middlesex boys in advance that Tony Mancelli is driving for the opposition. Tony has tossed so many people around during his career as a topclass wrestler that a few more Stock Car drivers added to the list won't make any difference.

28-CAR FINAL

In addition to the team matches we've also got a couple of real cracka-jack individual races. The first of them brings together fourteen real battlers and the other, eighteen newer drivers. These less experienced men will be all out to reach the top of the Stock Car tree as quickly as possible and they'll want to show that they too are fearless drivers striving to win at all costs.

Additional incentive to the leaders across the finishing line is a place in the grand final tonight in which there will be twenty-eight starters.

Unfortunately, it was not possible to stage the England v. America match but nevertheless we can look forward to another night of tip-top racing.
